India expanded its presence over the past week in key Indian Ocean Region states of Tanzania and Mozambique as part of its outreach. The first Indian Institute of Technology to be set up in Africa will come up in October in Tanzania. IIT Madras will set up its first international campus in Zanzibar, Tanzania, with plans to start the classes by October 2023, said its Director V Kamakoti. During his trip to Mozambique External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar took a ride in a 'Made in India' train in what would go a long way in establishing India a partner of choice in Africa. Meanwhile, President Samia Suluhu Hassan's efforts were lauded by Moodys that boosted ratings for politically stable Tanzania. Sudan, located along the Indian Ocean Region, yet again erupted in violence with military factions targeting each other. Diplomatic pressure is being stepped up to end the fighting in Sudan. Oman, known for its mediation capabilities, stepped up efforts to establish peace in the region with its Foreign Minister dialing his UAE and Egyptian counterparts. Meanwhile, Seychelles took a key step and announced to organise a health meet for some of IOR states.

He also met with the President of the Assembly of the Republic, Esperança Bias, with whom he discussed counter-terrorism, disaster resilience and green growth. The minister said that he also reiterated India's support for Mozambique's sustainable development. He visited the Shree Vishvambhar Mahadev Mandir in the capital city of Maputo before addressing a gathering

at the reception hosted by High Commissioner. Speaking at the event, the foreign minister said that these days, India does not speak only for itself, but for the Global South. "Transformational changes are happening in an Atmanirbhar Bharat that is putting us on a different trajectory," he added.

#### Sudan fighting: Outside pressure mounts for Eid ceasefire

Diplomatic pressure is being stepped up to end the fighting in Sudan which has left more than 300 people dead in the last week. The regular army has been fighting a paramilitary force called the Rapid Support Forces (RSF). The head of the army, General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, earlier dismissed the possibility of negotiations with the RSF. The latest hope of a temporary truce came after UN Secretary General António Guterres appealed for a ceasefire to allow civilians to reach safety.
